A. The 'Ten Commandments' - who are they for?

I. I am the LORD thy God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt...

II. Thou shalt have no other gods before Me.

Thou shalt not make unto you a graven image...

thou shalt not bow down unto them, nor serve them;

for I the LORD thy God am a **zealous God**... to **they that hate Me**;

& showing **mercy** unto... **they that love Me**

III. Thou shalt not carry the **NAME** of the LORD thy God in vain...

IV. Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy....

V. Honour thy father and thy mother...

VI. Thou shalt not murder.

VII. Thou shalt not commit adultery.

VIII. Thou shalt not steal.

IX. Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.

X. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's house; {S} thou shalt not covet thy neighbour's wife, nor his man-servant, nor his maid-servant, nor his ox, nor his donkey, nor anything that is thy neighbour's.

B. Statements or Commandments or Terms - see Devarim 4:9-15

II. Units of laws that we find later in the Torah

- A. Parshat Mishpatim - sampling of Jewish law [see Ramban]
Primarily "nezikin" [damages] and basic ethics of behavior
- B. Vayikra 19 - inserted in the center of Sefer Vayikra
- C. The Laws of Sefer Devarim- the primary collection of laws:
How to become God's NATION- i.e. a goy kadosh
