-1	I am Hashem	V	6	Don't murder	*
2	Don't worship other gods / don't make idols	×	7	Don't commit adultery	×
3	Don't swear falsely by Hashem's name	*	8	Don't steal	*
4	Keep Shabbat (work 6 days; don't work the 7th)	×	9	Don't bear false witness	
5	Honour your parents	V	10	Don't covet	×

1	Don't make idols	*	6	Do Aliyah l'Regel 3 times a year	
2	Celebrate Pesach in the spring	V	7	Don't sacrifice chametz	*
3	Give Hashem your firstborns	V	8	Don't have leftovers of Korban Pesach	*
4	Don't come empty- handed to Hashem	*	9	Bring Bikurim to Beit HaMikdash	V
5	Keep Shabbat (rest on the 7th day)	V	10	Don't cook meat in milk	*

They have been quick to turn aside from the way that I enjoined upon them. They have made themselves a molten calf and bowed low to it and sacrificed to it, saying: 'This is your god, O Israel, who brought you out of the land of Egypt!"

Don't come empty- Do bring gifts and sacrifices handed

Don't sacrifice Do bring unleavened sacrifices



Don't have Korban Pesach

leftover Do eat it all that night

Don't cook Do cook (and eat) each separately

Aseret HaDibrot are
still in play - we see
them repeated in
Devarim

and the "new" Ten
Commandments were already
part of the Torah before the
Golden Calf, back in Shmot 23



A new covenant?

The Torah is the same, and so is the covenant - the change was to a contract worded in a way that the people of the time were able to keep.
